THE RESOLUTION HEALTH SUPPORT PROGRAM

If you attended an Indian Residential School, you and your family may be eligible to receive health support services, such as:



Emotional Support: I can come to you and we can sit, talk, listen and provide support with anything you might need.

Professional Counselling: I can help provide you and your family with access to professional counselling services.

Traditional Cultural Support: This can be individually or within a group setting. This service provides access to traditional teachings, ceremonies and healers.

Transportation Assistance: This service may be offered when access to professional counselling and traditional cultural supports are not locally available.



The turnout was great !




2017 NOVA SCOTIA MI'KMAW SUMMER GAMES

Glooscap First Nation Project Updates

GLOOSCAP ADDITION TO RESERVE LAND

As requested by members, Glooscap is in the process of adding Glooscap Landing property to reserve. An addition to reserve process involves the band requesting that the Crown (INAC) add a piece of land to an existing reserve or create a new reserve.

The benefit of adding land to reserve is that it can improve community access to lands and resources, and increase community and economic development for a First Nation. In order to add land to a reserve, it must have no significant environmental concerns, it must be cost-effective and all third party issues be addressed. This requires the band to work with INAC, other government departments and neighbouring municipalities to be successful.

However, once a parcel of land becomes reserve, it is held for the use and benefit of all band members. Therefore, if a band wishes to have non-band owned businesses operating on the land which has been added to reserve, it must receive community support to enter into a designation. A designation allows a First Nation to set apart for leasing purposes all or part of its rights and interests in all or part of the land in the reserve while still maintaining its reserve status. This requires approval of the members through a community referendum vote. In order for the vote to be successful, the majority of those voting must vote in favour.

Once a positive vote is received, the band can then enter into leases with potential business owners.

UPLAND URBAN PLANNING ACCEPTS AWARD ON BEHALF OF GLOOSCAP FIRST NATION

The GFN Family Recreation Committee and UPLAND Urban Planning and Design won an Atlantic Planning Institution (API) Planning Excellence Award in the category of Public Outreach and Communication. The award was accepted by UPLAND on behalf of Glooscap First Nation at the API Conference held in PEI in October. Glooscap First Nation and UPLAND were awarded this prestigious award for their work done on the planning of the GFN Family Recreation and Culture Park. This includes the dedication of our community members in assisting in fundraising efforts and attending multiple community consultation sessions. The first phase of the project is the playground, which will be installed in early spring 2018.

MORE CLEAN ENERGY COMING TO GLOOSCAP FIRST NATION



Kings South MLA Keith Irving and Councillor Larry Peters were both on hand to announce a new program for Glooscap First Nation. Glooscap will be part of the Solar Electricity for Community Buildings Pilot Program that will allow Glooscap to sell solar generated electricity back to Nova Scotia Power through a 20-year Power Purchase Agreement. Glooscap will install over 50 panels on Glooscap Landing to sell power to Nova Scotia Power over 20 years, generating additional revenue for the community and provide a greener more renewable source of energy. Mi'kmaw communities in Nova Scotia currently produce more green energy than they use through ownership in wind power generating towers.
